Fr. Del... Points to Ponder

Blessed art thou among women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our

death. Amen. How many times have we prayed this prayer over the years? Every year on the Fourth Sunday of Advent, we ponder Mary's sacrificial love to cooperate with God's plan for her, giving birth to the Savior of the World. "Now, and at the hour of our death" may seem an odd reflection for Advent.

Aren't we supposed to be waiting for the birth of a baby in Bethlehem? Yes, and . . . We only celebrate the birth of Christ because we know the entire Paschal Mystery, His life and death. We still remember His death and Resurrection, even as we celebrate His birth: His alpha and omega. Certainly, it was not until Christ's presentation in the Temple, eight days after His birth, that anyone dared to think about His death. Seriously, who would think about a baby's death as they celebrate their birth?

By way of coincidence, last week, I read about a wristwatch that "works backward." With carefully programmed algorithms based on family history, current health status, where one lives in the world, and a number of other factors that I'm not smart enough to understand, the day of death is programmed into the watch. I am not kidding about this. So as a person glances at the clock to see what time it is, that person also sees how much longer they have to live. The watch tells not only the time, but also a countdown timer. If you are interested, and I am not, you may contact the French watchmaker, send your \$375,000 check, and *tempus fugis* is yours.

"Now and at the hour of our death" is clearly a statement about *God's* time and not *our* time. It's all up to God, and Mary possessed the grace to live with that reality. May we be as trusting in God as she was. May we be as open to life and death as Christ was. May we enter more fully into this Season of Advent with a heart and mind open to wherever God intends to lead us.

What in the world is this reading about?" Hopefully, this will help understand next week's readings.

CHRISTMAS

Is 9: 1-6; The words sung in Hadel's Messiah speak of the effective love of God, which outdoes any human ruler's ability. YOKE, POLE, ROD: symbols of oppression from an occupying force. WONDER-COUNSELOR: a person who needs no earthly advice. GOD-HERO: victorious warrior.

Ti 2: 11-14 Part of salvation is that we LIVE OUT our salvation, and Jesus shows us how to do this life for the greater coming of Christ in glory. BLESSED HOPE is the trust in the fullness of eternal life in the fullness of God's Kingdom. (Listen carefully to the Deliver us, O Lord prayer after the Our Father.)

Lk 2: 1-14 A homeless, helpless baby whose birth is caught in the powers of the world (Caesar's census) and revealed to the fringe of society (shepherds were on the low end of society) is how Emmanuel, God-with-us enters our world. Now that's one great and loving God who does this for us.

Prayer For Those Alone At Holiday Time

Dear Heavenly Father, the holiday season can be quite a trial and even a deep sadness to many people, especially those that are alone at this time, perhaps having lost a loved one through death or divorce or for some other reason.



Giving Yourself the Gift of Faith

"Tis the Season"...Every Season of the Year!

Every year, the church enters a season of preparation for Christ's second coming. Advent, a time for watching and waiting, should certainly give pause for reflection on our preparedness for ushering in the kingdom of God. During Advent, we make lists of our wants for Christmas and what we hope to receive from others. But this year, maybe add something you can do to enhance your faith life. Maybe your faith enhancement list could be ongoing and not just for Advent.

Throughout the year, adult faith formation opportunities are offered at Saint Andrew to help us grow in faith and understand the church's teachings. Have you given yourself the time to participate in the many faith formation opportunities? What a gift to yourself to strive to understand something as paramount as your faith in Christ!

So as you prepare a shopping list for gift giving to others, consider making a "faith" gift list for yourself. As a family, consider attending "Mass Plus +," which offers an understanding of our liturgy through the lens of the documents of the Second Vatican Council. Women, consider attending "Sacred Sisters Stories." This monthly gathering recalls the sacred witness of the holy women of yesterday and today. The very quiet witness of feminine religious spirituality has changed our world for the better (St. Teresa of Calcutta, Edith Stein, Dorthy Day, Julia of Norwich, etc...) and is still vitally needed in our world today. Men, consider attending "That Man Is You!" every Friday morning to deepen your spirituality as faith-fill witnesses in our families and communities. Dates and times for all faith formation programs are on our website. Individually consider "Bible Study," where we delve into the upcoming Sunday readings that allow us to get more out of our Sunday liturgy. It provides us time to open our ears and minds to the words proclaimed on Sunday and the message in the presider's homily and discuss their meaning in our lives and our church. These takeaways encourage us to live the message in the Scriptures.

"Tis the Season"...to grow in faith. But does growing in the faith need a season? Or should growing one's faith be every season throughout the year?
